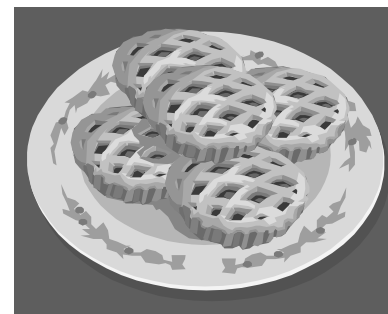
OUTING REPORTS
